
VISION STATEMENT



In 2019, generous donors provided \$5.4M, which was used to run the Masjid, Community Center, Al-Siddiq School, and Zakat assistance program as well as expanding endowment properties and remodeling projects; ending the year with a positive balance.

The Mosque Foundation garnered attention for civic involvement and activism. We have, and continue to play a pivotal role in encouraging community members to exercise their civic duty as American citizens by taking on a dynamic role in the political process.

We were also busy supporting Muslim families through educational and enrichment programs. We are blessed with multiple Imams, staff, and scores of volunteers, with the knowledge and expertise necessary to serve our community.

By aiming to address the needs of every component of an American Muslim's life, the Masjid takes a proactive, comprehensive approach to community service. As the center for numerous forms of outreach and education for our children, our programs and services meet the needs of all age groups at the Masjid, MFCC, MFEC, and Al-Siddiq School.

The Community Food Pantry continues to offer sustenance to lines of people, regardless of background. In 2019, the Masjid's Zakat assistance program provided over \$1.3M to local families in need and nonprofit organizations.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

The Mosque Foundation provides a welcoming and spiritual environment where community members pray with peace of mind and a sense of belonging. In its sacred space, thousands of people develop their spirituality, the needy come for assistance and support, and the troubled find personal help. The parking lots overflow with vehicles, as nearly 500 worshippers attend the five daily prayers, and thousands attend the two Jumu'ah congregational prayers.

Ramadan is a bustling month for the Masjid with nightly Taraweeh prayers; fundraising for numerous well-reputable humanitarian and relief organizations each night; youth programs; Qiyam prayers during the last ten nights; and Lailatul-Qadr on the 27th night.

The Mosque Foundation offers worshippers the opportunity to share their adahi with ease and convenience during the Hajj season through several organizations that distribute the sacrifices locally and abroad.





IMAMS & SOCIAL SERVICES

The Mosque Foundation is blessed to have devoted Imams who not only lead prayers and present lectures, but also provide counsel, guidance, and advice to community members in times of joy and distress. In 2019, some of these services include:

ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Building a stable foundation for generations to come is integral to the Mosque Foundation's mission. Through relevant educational programs, including study circles on multiple subjects for men and women, different age groups, in Arabic, English, and Spanish, the Masjid continues to cultivate Muslims who are well-versed in their faith. WOMEN'S PROGRAMS & ACTIVITIES

Women play a significant role in leading and participating in the development and execution of multiple programs and events throughout the year, including lectures, halaqas, the study of the Quran, fundraising, and building dynamic relationships with worshippers.

The exclusive and comprehensive schedule for women includes:

- Fiqh Class before Jumu'ah Prayer
- Lectures in English & Arabic
- Multilevel Quran Tilawa, Tajweed, Tafseer, Memorization
- Selected Lectures, Workshops & Seminars

The women's participation and contributions are vital to the efficiency and success of the Mosque Foundation. They strive to perfect their work, seeking the reward from Allah (SWT).



CHARITABLE AND ZAKAT ASSISTANCE

Throughout the year, the Mosque Foundation actively collects and distributes Zakat funds to those in need. In 2019, over 530 families, as well as charitable organizations that serve thousands locally and internationally, received financial aid totaling over \$1.3M.

The Mosque Foundation Community Food Pantry is going strong with 19 years of operation, serving 150-200 (Muslim and non-Muslim) families every week. The demographics of beneficiaries include struggling families, unemployed individuals, single mothers, elderly, and refugees.

Volunteers are the cornerstone of the Food Pantry, where approximately 25 volunteers run a smooth and efficient operation. The Pantry also allows students to fulfill their community service hours, offering a Muslim outlet to contribute their time for a charitable cause.

CHILDREN'S WEEKEND & SUMMER SCHOOL

Teaching is a dynamic profession. Islamic education in the early years of childhood has a lasting impression throughout life. The Mosque Foundation is blessed with two full capacity weekend schools: the long-established, Al-Siddiq Sunday School, and MFCC's Saturday Quran School.



MFCC SATURDAY QURAN SCHOOL

MFCC Saturday Quran School focuses on Islamic Studies and the successful--Noorania technique of reading the Quran. Our student body consists of boys and girls ages 5-12 years-old. The school's mission is to teach students how to systematically read the Quran through the Noorania program and instill a desire to memorize the Quran and correctly recite it the way it was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) in a safe and nurturing environment. Students study for four years to complete the Noorania book. After this, they train in the reading of the Quran with the proper tajweed and makharij. At this level, students read Arabic fluently. A Seerah course is taught in Arabic during the fifth year of study. For Islamic Studies, the school uses the 'Exploring Islam' series.



AL-SIDDIQ SUNDAY SCHOOL

Al-Siddiq is a weekend Islamic school with 560 students and 80 staff members. Our qualified staff is devoted to teaching and nurturing future Muslim generations. The school curriculum includes the Holy Quran, Islamic Studies, Hadeeth, Seerah, Aqeedah, Dua, Rituals, and Arabic language: reading, spelling, and grammar.

During the academic year, teachers at Al-Siddiq School participate in professional development workshops. Participants from the Education Committee, as well as outside speakers, lead workshops.

At Al-Siddiq school, we have a vibrant Activities Committee. Members oversee the Mother's Club, Lunch program, and the Library program. Members also provide programs to promote devotion to prayer and knowledge of Islam through competitions and guest speakers. They also manage other related events such as Islamic holidays and graduations.

MOSQUE FOUNDATION EDUCATION CENTER

MFEC houses the administration of Al-Siddiq school and used almost daily for quran memorization under Sh. Ahmed supervision and by several young male and female young huffaz who helps others study quran.



To keep one of the largest masajid in the Chicagoland area running like a well-oiled machine, it takes the hard work and commitment of volunteers assisting throughout the year. The Mosque Foundation is open seven days a week, up to 16 hours a day during the summer months, serving thousands of local Muslims. This would not be possible without our dedicated network of volunteers who seek nothing more than the desire to please Allah through helping others.

There are over 90 volunteers; men and women of all ages and backgrounds, whose efforts often go unnoticed yet, without which would undoubtedly result in chaos. From the smooth operation of the parking lots that are filled with over 3,500 worshippers each Friday, to the organization of over 20,000 worshippers arriving at SeatGeek Stadium for Eid prayer, it is clear that our volunteers keep everything running smoothly.

The Mosque Foundation Community Food Pantry, which opened with just a handful of volunteers 19 years ago, now has a team of 25 volunteers who work diligently for the sake of Allah. Volunteers serve 150-200 low-income families each week. Some volunteers pick up palettes of food and supplies from the Greater Chicago Food Depository. Others unpack, organize, and distribute. The dedication of these volunteers makes our pantry one of the most successful in the Chicagoland area.

The Mosque Foundation Board of Directors and the numerous committees are comprised of volunteers who lend their expertise and offer their time for the successful operation of all the Mosque Foundation's programs and activities.

Indeed, the Mosque Foundation is blessed to have a committed assembly of volunteers who provide support, professional skills, and assist in all functions and services, to ensure that community members have a positive experience each time they attend the Masjid. May Allah (SWT) reward them immensely and accept their deeds.
